Dear Chair Baldwin, Ranking Member Capito, Chair Aderholt, and Ranking Member DeLauro:

On behalf of the 180+ undersigned national, state, and local organizations, we urge Congress to provide \$1.6 billion in Fiscal Year 2025 for the Student Support and Academic Enrichment grant program, known as Title IV-A, authorized under the Every Student Succeeds Act.

This bipartisan flexible block grant supports investments in safe and healthy students, well-rounded education programs, and the effective use of technology in education. Robust and steady funding for Title IV-A helps ensure districts are able to provide a full array of services and learning opportunities that support the whole child and improves academic success for all students. As a formula-based program focused on the flexible, locally-determined use of funds, the grant ensures that a large number of geographically and socioeconomically diverse districts have resources they can direct in a manner that best addresses their particular needs. Title IV-A has continuously maintained bipartisan support in part because of the flexibility it affords states and districts to implement programming based on the specific needs of their school community.

Our 2023 survey of over 600 districts across the nation shows that, like Congress, district leaders also appreciate the program's flexibility. To that point, when asked about how districts invested in the many allowable uses, districts selected a wide-range of activities including, but not limited to: funding STEM and computer science programs, music and the arts, environmental education, International Baccalaureate and Advanced Placement courses (IB and AP), physical education, health and wellness, professional development for use of educational technology, violence prevention, behavioral and mental health supports and much more. Survey data also reveals that without increased funding, the expansion of existing programs and creation of new programs would not be possible. Title IV-A funding has long been the funding stream to support many of the activities districts have been using ESSER dollars to support. Increased funding for Title IV-A will be especially critical as ESSER funds dry up, inflationary pressures persist, and districts look to continue these critical programs.

This federal investment is absolutely essential to supporting comprehensive student needs, ensuring a safe and healthy school environment, and increasing access to a well-rounded education necessary for students to thrive in a modern society and workforce. For these reasons, we urge Congress to fund the Title IV-A flexible grant program at \$1.6 billion in FY 2025.

Thank you for your consideration of this request. We look forward to working with you to ensure these investments continue to support districts, educators, and students in a manner tailored to their unique needs.
